Nationwide, 20% of youth who age out of the foster care system become immediately homeless; 25% within four years.*

Communities for People (CFP) continues to expand and provide specialized services to support youth ages 16–22 with essential skills and resources for a successful transition to adulthood—particularly for those without a dependable family safety net. We remain committed to growing our reach with extended services and family preservation services, so we can better support youth and families affected by foster care and help close the gap for young people who would otherwise age out without a permanent home.

Pathways to Independence

Pathways to Independence is designed to help youth avoid the common pitfalls those with lived experience in the child welfare system often face by targeting young adults nearing their transition out of state-supported services. This program is designed for youth 18+ involved with DCF, who live independently in the Boston region and access a range of case management supports to help them succeed including:

- · Housing navigation
- · Educational and vocational support
- Linkage to mental health and substance use resources
- Development of a healthy and stable support network of peers and adults

Pathways participants will also have access to flex funding for emergency supports and immediate basic needs as a last resort to prevent youth from going into crisis, becoming homeless, or living in unsafe conditions.

Home-Based Services in Massachusetts

Communities for People is excited to announce the launch of two powerful home-based treatment programs in Massachusetts: **Enhanced Family Support Services (EFFS)** and **Family Centered Treatment**® **(FCT)**. Both are designed to strengthen families, promote stability, and keep children safe and connected to their loved ones.

Enhanced Family Support Services (EFFS) is a strengths-based, in-home treatment program that helps families stay together or reunify despite significant stressors. EFFS supports parents and caregivers in building the skills necessary to ensure children's safety, health, and well-being. Using high-fidelity Motivational Interviewing, the program offers a variety of services from behavior management to family counseling, and much more.

Family Centered Treatment® (FCT) is an evidence-based, intensive family and community-based program. This nationally recognized, evidence-based intervention gives families proven tools to strengthen relationships and overcome challenges. Therapists receive independent oversight from the model developer, ensuring fidelity to the model and the best outcomes for families.

Through in-the-moment, hands-on opportunities to practice change, families learn to take ownership of their progress. Unlike other home-based programs, FCT emphasizes the importance of each family member valuing and sustaining the changes they make.

Together, EFFS and FCT provide Massachusetts families with the tools, skills, and support they need to create safer, healthier, and more connected homes — and to make those positive changes last.

Celebrating Graduates

This year, Lucas achieved a remarkable milestone—graduating from the YouthBuild – Just-A-Start Program with a certificate in Biotechnology, as well as completing the Youth Program. His accomplishments are a testament to his hard work, determination, and personal growth.

Lucas was one of two graduates from our Dorm program this year, and we proudly cheered him on as he crossed the stage in his cap and gown, marking the culmination of years of effort. Despite challenges along the way, he stayed the course, and we celebrated with a special cake from Cakes for Kids. Youth Development Services

Youth Development Services continues to be a critical program for youth who have experienced foster care and are transitioning to independence. This year **over 100 youth completed work readiness and financial literacy programs**, further preparing them for independence. Additionally, the program **matched money saved by 57 youth, totaling \$38K.** YDS also **awarded 316 youth teen grants that totaled \$59K**. These opportunities financially help youth as they transition while teaching them about importance of saving.

Our 23rd Summer Session of iWorks with Suffolk University: A Pathway for Opportunity



CFP is proud to work in partnership with Suffolk University's Moakley Center for Public Management, and DCF to support youth career development through our **iWorks Internship Program**. This innovative initiative connects youth with meaningful internships, empowering them with real-world experience, mentorship, and a vision for their future careers.

They complete the interview process and it is a boost of confidence, a networking opportunity, and great practice for many youth entering the workforce for the first time. This program is about more than summer jobs. It's about equity, access, and showing young people that their voices, skills, and futures matter. We're deeply grateful to Suffolk University and all participating employers for making this initiative possible. We hired an intern, Lulabel, through this program who supported our marketing department. She explained why this program was right for her:

Before entering the workforce, I connected with friends, family, and the Department of Children and Families to explore job programs for youth, since online applications weren't effective for me. That's when I found iWorks, a supportive team that helps people find job opportunities.

My experience working with the iWorks Internship Program so far has been amazing. I was shy and unfamiliar with everyone—I was even shy with myself when it came to learning new skills. But we gained valuable insights into job preparation for teens, covering appropriate attire, essential purchases, and effective strategies for successful interviews.


